At the outset, Mrs Rajesh Kumari, Chairperson extended warm welcome to all the members of the Board and expressed her deep gratitude towards them for having spared their valuable time for attending the meeting. She appreciated the services and role of Dr Bajpai in the unprecedent growth and development of the institute during his tenure. She then requested Dr OP Bajpai, Director and Member institute during his tenure. She then requested Dr. Bajpai also extended Secretary to conduct the proceedings of the meeting. Dr. Bajpai also extended welcome and expressed gratitude towards Chairperson and other members of the Board for their coming all the way to attend the meeting.

Before taking up the various agenda items, Dr. O.P. Bajpai, Member-Secretary reported the following new initiatives, distinctive programmes and performance of the institute since the last BOGs' Meeting i.e. January 27, 2006:

- A National Conference on 'Advances in CAD/CAM Technology' was held on 23rd –24th March, 2006 which was attended by 83 persons.
- 2. Distance Education Network towards EDUSAT utilization has been established through which regular transmission on technology programmes has started since 2nd December, 2005 (9.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.). Various training programmes for subject experts were conducted p.m.). Various training programmes for subject experts were conducted for EDUSAT transmission. Similarly a consultancy project on Video Film Production for EDUSAT transmission has been undertaken on behalf of the Govt. of Haryana who have agreed consultancy amount of Rs. 25 lac.
 - In the current academic year, response to Modular Masters' Degree Programmes in six disciplines viz (i) Engineering Education, (ii) Manufacturing Technology, (iii) Construction Technology & Management, (iv) Computer Science & Engineering, (v) Instrumentation & Control and (vi) Electronics & Communication Engineering remained excellent. 87 (vi) Electronics & Communication Engineering regular programmes and candidates have been admitted to ME/M.Tech regular programmes and 126 ME/M.Tech Modular Programme from 20 states of the country.
 - 4. The institute has been recognised as a Research Centre of Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar for Ph.D. Programmes. It was also reported that six students have admitted the institute for Ph.D. under QIP Polytechnics and 10 students are likely to be admitted for M.E. under QIP.



- 5. The institute conducted three Induction Training Programmes sponsore by AICTE in which 111 persons participated. This is the new programm initiated by the institute.
- 6. The Govt. of India, MHRD constituted a Review Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. D. Acharya, Chairman, AICTE for all the for NITTTRs. The Review Committee visited the institute on April 13, 2006. The following documents were prepared and submitted to the Review Committee.
 - Highlights of Programmes and Activities undertaken by the Institut during 2000-2006 (March, 2006)
 - Strengths and Weaknesses of the faculty of the institute (May, 2006)
 - Report on A new Concept/Direction/Orientation to NITTTRs (June 2006)
- 7. The Institute has submitted proposal to the MHRD for introducing 27 reservation for OBCs in the Post Graduate Programmes run by th institute and proposed Rs. 75 crores for its implementation.
- 8. It was also reported that during the year the institute has conducted 11 courses for polytechnics and 92 for engineering colleges in which 126 teachers from polytechnics and 1253 teachers from engineering college participated. Besides, the institute has conducted 11 workshops with 50 participants and one seminar in which 83 participants were present.

Thereafter the various agenda items were deliberated as under:

ITEM NO.B.5.1(a) TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE 4th MEETING OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF NITTE CHANDIGARH HELD ON 27.01.2006 AND TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN THEREON.

While confirming the minutes of the 4th meeting of the Board of Governors held of 27.1.06, the Board observed that the empanelment of Fortis Multi Specialty Hospital Mohali for providing medical treatment facilities to the institute faculty and staff and their dependents vide Item B.4.4.13, the reimbursement should be limited to the rates applicable in the CGHS recognized hospitals for the city of Chandigarh. A regards the pensioners the Board directed that the institute should explore the possibility of providing medical facilities to the pensioners and their dependents be way of insurance in the similar manner as has been done by IIT, Madras, II Kharagpur & IISc, Bangalore. It was finally deliberated that the Fortis Multi Special Hospital, Mohali may be empanelled as approved for medical treatment for the institute faculty and staff with rates limited to the rates applicable to the Central Governor that the control of the control of

Employees under the CGHS Scheme in any CGHS Recognized Hospitals at Chandigarh.

ITEM NO.B.5.1(c) AGAINST ITEM NO. B.4.1.

TO CONSIDER AUDIT AND INSPECTION REPORT ON THE ANNUAL ACCOUNTS OF THE INSTITUTE FOR THE YEAR 2003-04 --- PUDA COURT CASE.

B-PUDA CASE

This item was also discussed in the meeting of Finance Committee and the following resolution was passed:

The Member-Secretary apprised the committee about the past history of PUDA Court Case and its progress from time to time as well as the steps taken by the institute to protect institute's interest. After hearing the Member-Secretary, the Committee advised to ascertain whether the PUDA consultancy was an institutional consultancy or consultancy undertaken by Prof. R.Subramanian and others. The Court case be pursued accordingly. It was also advised that the institute should take up consultancy work only in the areas of expertise and not beyond the scope of the institute activities. The Committee also advised the institute to come up with rules and regulations for undertaking consultancy work which should inter alia provide the following also:

1. List of areas of consultancy and relevance of consultancy work to the activities of the institute or areas of work of the institute.

2. MOU with Director of the Institute and with the Agency

3. MOU approval/report regarding consultancy work to the Finance Committee & Board of Governors.

4. Maintenance of proper record relating to consultancy work.

Liability of the institute/Government

6. Rules for distribution and utilization of the consultancy fund.

7. The list of areas of consultancy should be reviewed from time to time.

8. Minimum work order for consultancy if it is not related to education and training.

The Board considered the above said resolution and approved the same.

TO APPROVE THE ACTION INITIATED BY THE INSTITUTE REGARDING THE POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME - DEEMED UNIVERSITY STATUS.

The Member-Secretary apprised the committee about admissions in M.E./M.Tech. (Modular and Regular) programmes. He also informed the committee

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that many students have requested for fellowships for both modular and regul M.E./M.Tech. programmes. The institute has taken up their request with MHRD/AICTE for instructions/directions and budgeting provision. After deliberations, the Committee advised the institute to pursue the matter for Deeme University/Central Institute Status with the Ministry and report its progress from time to time.

The above said resolution was approved by the Board.

ITEM NO.B.5.4.2 TO CONSIDER FILLING UP OF VARIOUS VACANT SENIOR TECHNICAL NON-TEACHING GROUP 'A' POSTS IN THE INSTITUTE.

It was resolved that the nomenclature of the posts as mentioned in the agenda item and the qualifications prescribed for each be reviewed and updated keeping in view the functional requirement of the institute as well as pay scale of each post. This exercise be done by the institute in consultation with MHRD. Thereafter, the essential technical posts may be filled by the institute as per recruitment rules. It was, however, further resolved by the Board that direct recruitment against all the vacant posts including faculty positions in the institute should be filled up before the release of Dr. O.P. Bajpai or kept in abeyance until availability of regular Director of the institute.

ITEM NO.B.5.4.3 AMENDMENT IN THE RECRUITMENT RULES REGARDING PROMOTIONS TO THE POSTS OF UDC, ASSISTANT, SUPERINTENDENT AND SECTION OFFICER.

It was resolved that upto the level of the Assistant, promotions may be considered on seniority-cum-fitness basis as per institute rules by having just a job/trade related test of the eligible employees. However the existing procedure and rules for promotion above the level of Assistant will continue to be followed.

After completing the various agenda items Dr. OP Bajpai, Director informed the Board that consequent upon his selection in the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra for a term of five years, he has submitted his resignation from the post of Director, NITTTR, Chandigarh with the request that he may be relieved of his duties on 17 August, 2006 A.N. Keeping in view the commendable work done by Dr. OP Bajpai during his tenure as Director of the institute, all the members were

unanimous over the opinion that Dr. Bajpai's resignation will be a great setback to the institute. It was resolved that the appreciations for the commendable work done by Dr OP Bajpai for the institute during his tenure as Director must be placed or record and conveyed to him. The Board resolved to wish Dr. Bajpai very good luck and success on his new assignment.
