ITEM NO. B.48.5.6 MERGING/RENAMING OF SOME DEPARTMENT FOR CONSOLIDATION OF MANPOWER AND ACTIVITIES

The institute has 14 departments/centres. Centre like ETV and Media are having only one faculty member each. Due to administrative requirement, we have separate HODs offices for which manpowers are engaged. The Government in the recent time is very rigid on the implementation of 1:1.1 ratio. The institute is kept on hold with a directive to not to fill up any non-teaching posts to maintain the Government requirement of 1:1.1 ratio.

The institute came into existence in 1967 and by the year 2000, majority of posts were sanctioned. The institute has 65 teaching posts (64 faculty + Director) and 183 non-teaching staff. As per the decision of 1:1.1 ratio, the institute is supposed have 72 non-teaching staff. Later decision of the Ministry to impose 1:1.1 ratio is now a big bottleneck to fill up many crucial positions like Accounts Officer, Accountant. sanctioned Administrative Officer, Technicians for Laboratories etc. Therefore, it is merging manpower by the consolidate required departments/Centres where the faculty strength is one to five. Now, it is not viable to provide secretarial support to such departments. Therefore, looking into futuristic requirements of the institute and for re-adjusting the manpower in the priority areas, it is proposed to merge 4 departments in the first phase to create only two departments as stated below:-

- Computer Science and Engineering Department and Information Management & Coordination shall be merged to be renamed as Department of Informatics and Computer Science and Engineering.
- 2. Media Centre and ETV Centre shall be merged to be renamed as Department of Multimedia & Virtual Reality Engineering.

With this consolidation, these renamed departments shall be in a position to offer various training programmes in emerging areas and start Master Degree Programmes in the upcoming areas. Secretarial manpower withdrawn from these departments shall be placed in the Library or in the priority sections to take the load that requires presence of regular manpower.

ITEM NO. B.48.5.7 REDUCING THE POST DEAN FROM THREE TO TWO AND MAKING IT NON-HONORARIUM BASED POST.

The institute created the Dean positions on the decisions of 27th and 36th Board of Governors meeting held on 24.4.2013(Two Deans :Research & Development and Extension Services) and 09.08.2016(One Dean Academics & International Affairs). Now there are three Dean positions:-

- 1. Dean, Academic & International Affairs
- 2. Dean, Research & Development
- 3. Dean, Extension & Consultancy Services

These are not sanctioned posts but are to facilitate the administration. But while reviewing the outcome of the various past Dean's activities, it is observed that the institute has not been benefited much. Deans are paid honorarium of Rs. 3000/- per month. Hence, it is proposed that in future the honorarium will be stopped and only telephone bill shall be reimbursed limiting to maximum Rs. 1000/- per month. It is also further proposed to have only two Dean positions i.e.(i) Dean Consultancy and Extension Services (ii) Dean Academic and Research. Till the seniority amongst direct and CAS professor are settled based on the decision of Hon'ble Court, the institute is following two separate seniority list one for direct professors and another for CAS professors.

Hence, it is proposed to appoint Dean Academic and Research from the list of direct Professors and Dean Consultancy and Extension Service from the list of CAS professors in future. The positioning of Dean is a facilitation to the institute administration. Hence, Director based on seniority and performance will nominate the Dean who will have tenure of two years only. This will be effective once the Dean (R&D) completes his present tenure. The Dean (Academics & International Affairs) and Dean (Research & Development) shall be clubbed as Dean (Academics & Research & Development).

Institute vide letters dated 15.02.2011 asked for the status of Ph.D from Mrs Poonam Syal Mrs Lini Mathew.

Mrs Lini Mathew vide letter dated 23.02.2011 submitted her Ph.D Status and requested to for one year extension to complete her Ph.D. and Mrs Poonam Syal vide her request dated 24.02.2011 submitted her Ph.D status.

Both the above faculty members vide their individual letter dated 01.07.2011 requested the authority to grant extension for 2 years to complete their Ph.D.

Their requests for extension were placed before the Board of Governors in its 20th meeting held on 25.06.2011.

Hon'ble Board of Governors granted an extension of one year and further directed that as the faculty members have not fulfilled the prescribed condition, their next increment may be stopped.

Decision of the Board of Governors were transmitted to the concerned faculty members vide letters dated 23.08.2011.

Non completion of Ph.D case of the above faculties were again placed before the Board of Governors in its 21st meeting held on 21.10.2011.

Decision of the Board of Governors vide letters dated 23.08.2011 was transmitted to the concerned faculty members.

Above faculty members vide their letters dated 14.12.2011 and 16.12.2011 submitted the reasons for non completing their Ph.D.

Status of Ph.D of the above faculties were again placed before the Board of Governors in its 23rd meeting held on 13.03.2012.

Hon'ble Board granted the extension for one year more to Mrs Poonam Syal and same was communicated to Mrs Poonam Syal.

Mrs Poonam Syal vide her letter dated 11.03.2013 again requested to grant extension for more 6 months to complete her Ph.D.

Dr. Lini Mathew vide her request dated 02.04.2013 after obtaining her Ph.D degree requested to restore her stopped increment from July to December. 2012.. Her increment restoration case was placed in 28th Board of Governors meeting but Hon'ble Board of Governors not acceded to her request and same was communicated to the applicant.

Dr.Poonam Syal vide her letter dated 06.03.2014 submitted her Ph.D degree notification.

Dr. (Mrs) Lini Mathew vide her letter dated 08.05.2014 requested to grant Promotion under CAS as Professor under CAS.

The case of promotion for the post of Professor was placed before the Board of Governors in its 30th meeting held on 02.06.2014.

The Board resolved as under:-

"The Board of Governors after noting the status of Ph.D in respect of Mrs Poonam Syal and Lini Mathew directed the Institute that that their cases for promotion as professor under Career Advancement Scheme be considered after three years from the date of completion of Ph.D of the individual faculty. Board of Governors also directed the Institute to get information from other NITTTRs, how similar cases are being dealt with before implementing the decision of Board of Governors".

In compliance the decision of the Board of Governors, the Institute wrote various letters on the issue to other NITTTRs.

There was no prescribe guidelines and no reply in this regard was received from other NITTTRs. Item for the same was placed before the Board of Governors in its 33rd meeting.

Board resolved as under:-

"After detailed deliberations on the issue the Board did not acceded to the request of the Institute to consider the promotion under the Career Advancement Scheme without imposing three

years condition from the date of completion of Ph.D in the case of Dr. Lini Mathew and Dr. Poonam Syal".

Their case of promotion for the post of Professor under Career Advancement Scheme was placed before the Board of Governors in its 41st meeting held on 29.06.2018. Hon'ble Board resolved as under:-

"After deliberating on the agenda item, the Institute was advised to communicate with the AICTE and seek a clarification in the matter at the earliest".

The institute did not receive any clarification from AICTE despite repeated reminders and personal attempts.
